- Purchases of hunting licenses and hunting equipment include taxes levied by the Pittman-Robertson Act. This tax provides about \$3-1/2 million per day to fund wildlife conservation and other related activities. - <https://tinyurl.com/y8wt5ec3>.
- I encourage membership in the NRA. Each NRA member should encourage everyone they know to join. Get a substantial instructor's discount on NRA memberships today at <https://membership.nra.org/recruiters/join/XR016818>. Membership benefits include your choice of three magazines (*American Rifleman*, *American Hunter*, and *America's First Freedom*), \$1,000 in firearms insurance, \$10,000 accidental death insurance, and discounts on rental cars and hotels. Youth members also get a subscription to *InSights* magazine. The most important reason to join, however, is that your membership helps give the NRA the horsepower it needs to fight the ongoing battle against gun control. If it weren't for the efforts of the NRA, there would be no 4-H Shooting Sports program.
- One characteristic of the Internet is the constant flood of emails containing hoaxes and out-of-date information. Among these are emails containing incorrect information about gun rights and legislation affecting those rights. The NRA publishes a daily email newsletter with factual information regarding your gun and hunting rights. You can sign up for this free newsletter at <https://www.nra.org/sign-up/>.

As always, I remind our shooters to practice their shooting skills regularly, both live shooting at the range and dry-firing at home.

- Always follow the NRA rules of gun safety
- Handle firearms only with your parents' permission and adult supervision
- When dry-firing, always ensure your gun is empty and never have any ammunition in the same room
- Always concentrate on the fundamentals of shooting – make good shooting form a habit
